



Finger Lakes Region Science Coordinators and Teachers Program

The Finger Lakes Institute at Hobart and William Smith Colleges in Geneva NY will be hosting a training session on September 12th from 8 am - 3 pm for science teachers interested in participating in the **Science on Seneca** field trip program for students in grades 7-12.

Science on Seneca (SOS) is an EPA award-winning educational outreach program of the Finger Lakes Institute at Hobart and William Smith Colleges. The program was established by the faculty at the Colleges and is based on the environmental study of Seneca Lake. **SOS** enables regional science teachers to provide their students with an outdoor classroom experience on Seneca Lake using *The William Scandling*, Hobart and William Smith Colleges' 65-foot research vessel. To participate, science teachers must complete a day-long training session to acquaint themselves with the Science on Seneca program and facilities. **The training is free and open to any teacher in the region.**

For a **nominal fee of \$15** per group, teachers may bring their classes back to Geneva to conduct aquatic research utilizing the resources of our unique floating classroom. Teachers can apply their experience from the SOS training and field trip to utilize lessons and resources which can be found on the Science on Seneca interactive Web site.
